

MORS BAGS

Mors bags are reusable fabric shopping bags... made by you!

In a quest to get everyone to cut down on using plastic bags, the idea is to make a shopping bag to give away and, by using the *Mors* label on the bag it advertises the project, thus spreading the word.

The bags are easy to make, using scrap fabric, old sheets, clothes etc

The Mors Bag website (www.morsbags.com) has the pattern and instructions on how to make one (plus a pattern for making a bag for a wheelchair), as well as a shop where you can obtain the Mors labels (sold to you at cost). Alternatively you can email craft@mfwl.org.uk and we will send you a pattern. The bags do not need to be perfect (or even lined!)... Anything goes!

Middlesex Federation of WIs is now a 'pod' (hub) for Mors Bags made by anyone within MFWI. Any of our members are able to register to join the pod. This enables us to record the number of bags made and given away. If you do not wish to register, it is not a problem - you just need to let us know how many bags you make so we can add them to the MFWI tally. It would be good to see photographs of what you have made, please send to the craft@mfwl.org.uk glass.
